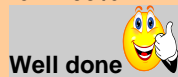

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

This Sunday we hear about how Jesus was a great teacher. Let's think about how important it is for everyone to get a chance to go to school and learn.

What do you remember from the Gospel reading?

Jesus starts to teach in the temple, where the Jewish people went to pray. The people are surprised and impressed with the way he teaches. Why do you think that is?

The people in the temple believe what Jesus says and they trust him, more than the teachers they usually listen to. Why did they see Jesus as special?

Jesus teaches the people through the stories he tells. But he also teaches them - and us - through the things he does. He lives out what he is teaching. Can you think of an example when Jesus teaches us through his actions? What does he want us to learn?

Teachers are very important, they help us to learn about all sorts of things. What is your teacher's name? What do they help you to learn? Who else helps you to learn? Family or friends perhaps?

Some children who live in poorer countries around the world do not have the chance to go to school. Can you think of reasons why that might be?

Some children live in places where it isn't safe for them to travel to school or the school is too far away. Some children have to do jobs instead of going to school or they have to look after their little brothers and sisters while their mum and dad go to work. Some families cannot afford to pay the school fees or buy the uniforms or books their children need to go to school.

Do you think it is fair that these children do not have the chance to learn?

What do you think can be done to help?

Every child has a right to go to school. The charity CAFOD works together with local people around the world to make sure more children can learn.

Faizah lives in a village in Sudan. Her school had no roof, so when it rained the pupils and teachers simply got wet. There were no seats and it was hard to get books and stationery. But now, Faizah's school has been rebuilt. CAFOD worked with local experts to provide chairs, stationery, books, everything that the children and teachers need to learn and teach well.

Faizah says, "The school is beautiful. We're very proud of it. Now we have proper classrooms and chairs and it's less stressful and easier to learn."

Let's try this week to do our best to learn. To listen to our teachers, our parents, and all those who try to teach us the way.

And let us try to listen to Jesus and to what he is teaching us too, so that together we may love one another as he asks us to.
