Focus: The text will be Blackberry Blue by Jamila Smith. The writing outcome will be narrative with a focus on cohesion within a text and descriptive writing.

Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling:

Children will be continuing to focus on further developing the aspects of grammar and punctuation they have learnt this year, applying it to their writing in all subjects.

Maths

Focus:

During this half term children will be using their maths skills to apply them to problem solving situations and real-life events. And doing lots of investigations. Children will look at topics covered in KS2 to consolidate learning.

Topic

History: What was life like in Tudor England
Pupils will extract information about Henry VIII and the Tudor period from portraits and written records and justify their interpretations using evidence from sources. In addition, they will make deductions about marriage, power and punishment and use their knowledge of inventories, to create a realistic Tudor inventory. Finally, pupils will select the relevant evidence required from sources and write an eyewitness account of Elizabeth I's Worcester Progress.

RE

Reconciliation:

Children will be learning about and understanding the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Other Faiths - Islam:

Children will be learning about the 5 pillars of Islam and how Muslims use the Qu'ran.

Universal Church topic – Common Good:

Children will be learning about The Beatitudes, Catholic social teaching related to The Common Good, personal responsibility, justice and respect.

PSHE

Focus: British values

As part of our PSHE focus for this half term, children will recap their learning around British values. They will learn of their importance in ensuring we live in a just society that is fair and equal for all.

Focus: Transition and conception
