## Lunches brought from home

Packed lunches brought to school should contain healthy options, no drinks as drinking water is provided both in the dining hall and on the playground. There are a few alternative healthy options below if your child is bored with sandwiches: filled bread roll, pita bread, cheese sticks, yogurt, a piece of fruit, plain biscuit e.g. digestive, healthy fruit bar.

**NO packets of crisps, chocolate, fizzy drinks/juices etc.**



If you are looking for something different most food shops (Tesco's, Asda's, Sainsbury's) stock healthy child sized snacks e.g. bread sticks with houmous. It is important that you inform the office if your child is changing from school dinners to packed lunch in advance. You must also inform the office in advance before your child can change to school meal, **giving at least a weeks' notice. Thank you.**
