



Remote Learning Information

Google Classroom is a secure learning network for teachers, pupils, and schools. It provides a safe way for us to connect, share content, access remote learning and receive class information. It is accessible online and through any mobile device with internet capabilities.

St Anne's are committed to ensuring our children continue to learn. Whilst learning is important, the wellbeing of our school community is at the forefront. We understand that there may be times of illness, caring for the vulnerable and other children within the home and this must be the priority. However, we will endeavour to work in partnership with our learners and their families learn remotely when this is needed.

Remote learning is where pupils cannot physically come into school. When this happens, their learning will take place online. Work will be set by the teachers using the Google Classroom platform. It is important that children complete the work set. Some learning may include links to videos and pre-recorded lessons e.g. White Rose and Oak Academy. Routine is key for children when learning at home and teachers will try to set work in line with the children's usual class timetables. Remote learning offered should be equivalent length to usual core teaching time. KS1 = 3 hours and KS2 = 4 hours. We appreciate that due to the need for parents and carers to work from home, access to suitable electronic devices of the internet may be limited which will affect your child's ability to follow the timetable rigidly. We will also offer daily live sessions through Google Classroom, so that the teacher and children can meet each other and discuss the learning.

This online learning will be adapted for our SEND pupils. Pupils with additional needs who have difficulties learning online will be provided with learning packs by the SENCO.

The EYFS will use Class Dojo to provide remote learning for their children.

Each day, the children will receive a pre-recorded phonic and maths session for their morning session. There is then a planned activity linked to one of the foundation subjects for the children to complete in the afternoon. The children log on for a live session each day as a whole class to share a story, and small group live sessions will also be planned over the week, focusing on a game that is linked to listening and talking (CLL).

Expectations

Children and parents should adhere to the following guidelines:

- Pupils should access their learning page daily.
- They need to complete the work set and upload it each day. At a minimum, the English (daily reading and written task), maths and RE lessons must be completed.
- Pupils are expected to log on for the live sessions each day, as attendance will be recorded and reported.
- Pupils need to have high expectations of themselves and their learning at all times.
- Parents are asked to support the children with their learning as best they can, although the pupils should do the tasks independently.
- Teachers will provide work for children to complete at home that matches their usual class timetable as much as possible.
- The teachers will try to match the work to your child's ability wherever possible.
- Teachers will respond to pupils' work where appropriate, offering feedback.
- Teachers will be available during the school day for the children to contact via Google Classroom, if they need further support with a learning task.

Teachers:

- Teachers will provide work for children to complete at home that matches their usual class timetable as much as possible.

Additional Information:

- We recognise that some pupils may not have suitable online access at home. We will do our best to support families with additional devices and internet connection where possible. Please contact the school if you need this help.
- We aim to be flexible in how the children complete the work set. You can collect exercise books from the school and individual teachers can advise on how best to use the resources offered.
