# Local Authority Safeguarding Visit – March 2026

On **12th March**, the school welcomed the Local Authority Safeguarding Lead for a routine safeguarding review. Meetings like this help schools reflect on their safeguarding practices and identify any areas where further improvements can be made.

We are pleased to report that the visit was **very positive**.

The review confirmed that the school has **strong safeguarding systems in place**. In particular, the visitor praised:

- The **team of safeguarding leads** supporting pupils.
- **Staff awareness and training** around safeguarding.
- The school's **record-keeping systems** and the way staff raise and respond to concerns.
- The **supportive and challenging role of governors**.

The visit confirmed that the school has **effective safeguarding practices and a strong culture of care**, ensuring that the safety and wellbeing of pupils remain a top priority.

## School Uniform

**All children should be wearing the correct school uniform. Our uniform policy states that Winter Uniform is to be worn until the Summer Term.**

**Our Summer Term begins when the children return after the Easter Holidays, 13<sup>th</sup> April 2026. Until then please follow the uniform policy for school uniform as below.**



### WINTER UNIFORM

#### Winter Uniform

- Boys Plain blue shirt and tie (no polo shirts)  
School sweatshirt with school logo  
Grey Long trousers **no unnecessary pockets**  
Socks short or long grey/black plain  
Shoes plain black  
Plain colour woolly hat
- Girls Plain blue blouse and tie (no polo shirts)  
School sweatshirt/cardigan with school logo  
Plaid kilt  
Socks short or long grey/plain grey tights  
Shoes plain black  
Plain colour woolly hat

Maroon blazers are optional for both boys and girls.

**In our early Years** all children should be wearing their winter uniform as well. Navy jogging/track bottoms, light blue polo shirt and school sweatshirt.

#### General

All pupils Hairstyles must be appropriate for school. Examples of inappropriate hairstyles include, but are not restricted to, Mohicans, gelled hair, multi- coloured hair, over elaborate hair extensions, and lines or designs shaved into the hair. Long hair must be tied back with a simple elastic –sensibly sized bows/clips and bobbles that mirror St Anne's school colours may be worn. Only plain gold or silver round stud earrings may be worn – no other stones, shapes or designs. Sensible, plain watches may be worn. Necklaces should be avoided but if they are worn (cross and chain only) they should be tucked underneath clothing and removed for PE; otherwise, they pose a health and safety risk. No other jewellery is permitted.
